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Compare to Jesus cursing the fig tree in Mark 11.

 - = an Erosion of confidence in the sufficiency of Christ (Christ is <u>enough</u>.)



The seed among the Thorns:

Distracted by the delights and demands of this world



The seed among the Thorns:

- Distracted by the delights and demands of this world
 - = an Erosion of confidence in the supremacy of Christ (Christ satisfies.)

The faith that endures even through suffering and death is a faith that <u>has</u> already died to self for the sake of a supreme, single-minded pursuit of Christ and spreading the fame of His name.
